- bank fees and charges
- motor vehicle expenses, running costs (trips to the post office, to pay bills, purchase stationary etc)
- business operating expenses
- education and training expenses
- electricity costs
- home office expenses where the home is used for business
- interest on money borrowed
- office stationery
- costs for operating a commercial website, such as updating content and features, internet service provider fees, website hosting, domain name registration
- parking fees
- phone expenses
- rates on business premises
- registered tax agent and accountant fees
- rent or lease of premises
- salary, wages, bonuses or allowances paid
- subscription costs for business or professional journals, information services, newspapers and magazines
- super contributions
- tax preparation costs
- postage expenses
- advertising expenses, business cards
- water rates on business premises
- all office furniture (desk, chair, filing cabinets etc) furnishings, carpet, curtains
- cleaning costs
- computers, printers, software, modems, fax etc
- mobile phone
- business travel expenses (to trade shows, markets, expos etc)
- rent and repairs
